There are families in our community who can't afford personal hygiene items like soap or toothpaste because SNAP benefits (food stamps) do not cover them. Give 25 cents for every toothbrush in your house.

The **Salvation Army** provides personal hygiene items as part of their food pantry program.

It's difficult to learn when you can't see the board or the test. Give 10 cents for every set of eyes in your home. Make your parents pay \$1 if they have glasses or contacts.

The Chautauqua Blind Association provides free vision screening to children under 5 so they can enter school ready to learn

By age 5, 90% of the brain's capacity is already developed. Give 5 cents for every book or toy that has helped you to learn.

The Chautauqua Lake Childcare Center provides high quality day care and early childhood education scholarships to working families through United

Many seniors face the threat of Give 10 cents for every meal or

snack you have eaten today. Meals on Wheels provides a

nutritious meal and a caring volunteer to homebound seniors in our community.

Having close friends can bring out your best qualities, be a positive influence and help you make good choices. Give 10 cents for every friend you have.

Mental Health Association provides peer coaches to provide support for those in recovery from substance abuse

Kids who have three or more adults who support them feel happier, more hopeful and do better in school. Give 25 cents for every adult that supports you.

Chautauqua Striders provides opportunities for mentoring youth in our community to make a positive impact on their future.

After a disaster people need mops. gloves and soap to clean their homes. Give 5 cents for each item in your house that helps you clean vour home.

The American Red Cross helps families in our community after a disaster like a house fire with emergency housing and supplies.

638 people in Chautaugua County experienced homelessness last year. Give 25 cents for every sleeping bag and bed in your house

The **UCAN City Mission** provides beds for homeless men in our community and helps them find homes so they can have safe consistent housing.

Almost 30% of families in Jamestown live on \$33 a day or less for family of 4. Give 30 cents for every job you've

dreamed about doing.

The **Resource Center** provides iob skills training and employment support to help people find work.

Using drugs slows brain activity and damages nerve cells making it harder to learn or get a job. Give 25 cents if you already knew about the dangers of drugs. Great job!

Prevention Works (CASAC) provides alcohol and substance abuse prevention education and intervention programs in all Chautaugua County schools

Only 41% of people who had a mental health disorder in the past year received professional help. Smile at each other and give \$1 if someone ends up laughing.

Family Service provides mental health counseling to home-bound individuals, offering sliding fee services or through funding from the United Way.

Last year, 719 Chautauqua County youth dropped out. Give 25 cents for every grade level you've passed.

The Relief Zone in Frewsburg provided tutoring to local students in their after-school program.

The Elderly are more vulnerable to becoming ill or depressed when they don't remain independent in their homes. Give 50 cents for every senior that is a part of your life.

Through United Way scholarships, Chautaugua Adult Day Services provides aging citizens a loving, community environment during the day.

A community that values its youth creates kids that grow up to be healthy leaders who value diversity and succeed in school. Give 25 cents if you live in a community that loves you.

**Cornell Cooperative Extension** provides leadership programs and scholarships to 4-H through United

The average homeless family in the U.S. stays in a shelter for 7-12 months before moving to permanent housing. Count the number of rooms in your house and give 10 cents for each one.

Last year, the YWCA "Transitions" Program provides provided temporary, supportive housing to 36 women in children in our community.

50% of all female business leaders were once girl scouts! Give 50 cents if you know a woman that is a leader.

Girl Scouts of WNY provides STEM and leadership activities for airls in our community.

Research shows that young people who learn to make good decisions and plan ahead do better in school. Make a list of everything you need to do tomorrow and give 5 cents for each item on your list.

Junior Achievement of WNY volunteers provided programs that fostered work readiness, entrepreneurship and financial literacy skills.

Access to transportation is a challenge in rural areas, especially for seniors who may not drive. Give 50 cents for each vehicle your family owns.

Last year, Community
Connections of Findlay Lake helped 48 seniors in rural areas make it to medical appointments. Young people are more likely to grow up healthy when their parents are involved in their education. Give 50 cents if either of your parents have ever helped you with homework.

Jamestown Community Learning Council provides "Parents As Teachers" home visitors to provide support and encouragement parents need.

Only about 51% of youth feel safe at home, at school and in their neighborhood.

Count the number of door locks in your home and give 10 cents for each one.

CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) provides a powerful voice for abused and neglected children in the foster care system.

Young people who are optimistic about the future have increased self-esteem and decreased emotional or behavioral problems. Give 25 cents if you feel hopeful about the future.

Child Advocacy Program's mission is to bring hope and healing to children by ending child abuse in Chautaugua County.

Young people who spend three hours or more a week in involved in the arts are more likely to grow up healthy. Sing a song and then give 50 cents, no matter how it sounds!

Infinity Visual & Performing Arts INSTILL leadership program provides support and opportunities to serve as role models for others.

Young people who serve others in the community for one or more hours a week are more apt to be respectful of others, helpful and kind, and patient. Give 25 cents for every time you helped someone without being asked.

Boy Scouts of America, Allegheny Highlands Council, encourages their troops to "help other people at all times" as part of their Scout's Honor.

Seniors who volunteer live longer and report better health by staying active physically and socially. Give 25 cents for every grandparent have in your life.

**RSVP** (Retired Senior Volunteer Program) has 125 volunteers that support many key community organizations in our area.

Last Year United Way Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) volunteers did over 800 tax returns for free for households in our community.

Give 20 cents just to say thank you to the 20 volunteers who did all those tax returns to help working families and seniors in our community.
